Books

With Heritage for All: Reclaiming the Radical Spirit of Historic Preservation. Under contract, West Virginia University Press. Full draft due February 2027.

This short volume explores the contemporary impasse within the American field of historic preservation, as it is torn between an extreme dismantling of its regulatory structure under the Trump administration and decades of calls for greater inclusivity and responsiveness to ordinary people's values. Historic preservation has never been so relevant to national political life, yet its reliance on regulatory power, academic training and real estate incentives are all unlikely to yield a stable future. *With Heritage for All* examines insurgent and marginalized projects that have shaped an alternative, egalitarian and radical preservation practice more relevant now than ever.

Another Modernism: Mass Housing, Architectural History and the Promise of Housing Justice. Full proposal submitted to Goldsmiths University Press' Spatial Politics Series, June 2026.

Another Modernism offers a new look at the disposition of modernist mass housing in the 21st century – a century marked by global crises in housing affordability, inhabitation

rights and the failure of elite disciplinary norms to safeguard against late capitalist re-emergent destruction of the modern welfare state and its architectural forms. The book is focused on the United States, where hostility toward the welfare state was pronounced from the inception of the New Deal through the ascendent-to-dominant neoliberal eras of Ronald Reagan, Bill Clinton, Barack Obama and Donald Trump. Two case studies anchor the study: Cochran Gardens Apartments in St. Louis, a public housing development whose tenants successfully gained management rights and altered buildings to suit their needs only to find preservation experts green-lighting demolition of the buildings; and Parkchester, a private low-rent development whose tenants today are exploring how to simultaneously fight gentrification and landlord negligence while engaging a landmark designation pushed by outside architectural historians. The work explores the gap between architectural historians' expertise and the lived expertise of place of mass housing residents, and whether that gap can be closed to align understanding of architectural significance with inhabitants' struggles to remain in place.

Edited Volumes

Housing Blocs: Ordinary Modernism Across the Atlantic, editor with Vladana Putnik Prica of 14-contributor volume. Full proposal under development for submission.

The edited volume pursues an interdisciplinary approach to comparative study of mass housing projects, their ordinary lives and their disposition (including threats to conservation) across the United States of America and the former socialist republic of Yugoslavia. Despite the Cold War divide in political economies across these nations, both simultaneously contributed to the largest production of modernist architecture in history, the global construction of mass housing. These projects are beginning to be reappraised as architecture, as housing and as social setting, but research gaps remain. Little research has explored the relationship between the capitalist US and the socialist states of Europe, beyond misleading characterization of mass housing as an inherently problematic instance of aesthetic modernism. The edited volume was seeded by a workshop in Belgrade, Serbia and a conference in Chicago, Illinois, and draws together scholars from both sides to explore key questions—and offer new ones for further research.

Upon the invitation of editor Jorge Otero-Pailos, I assumed the guest editor role for an issue of Columbia University's Graduate School of Architecture Planning and Preservation's journal of historic preservation theory. I developed a call for papers centered around the concept of “recovery” within the built environment (and its attendant multiple meanings, including preservation salvage, disaster recovery, ecological restoration, economic revitalization, trauma healing and restorative justice). The call for papers received 47 responses and has led to a double issue including 14 articles and two book reviews.
